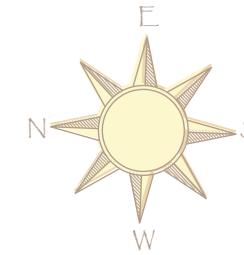


Wildlife Trails

Please Respect the Animals

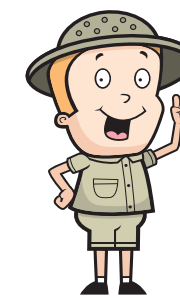

- Cisterns and rain barrels to reuse the rain throughout the zoo
- Stormwater wetland at the waterfowl exhibits

Indoor Exhibits

1 USS Antiquities

Our giant Pacific octopus exhibit greets you at the entrance of USS Antiquities. Several different species of fish, sea stars and anemones also live in the exhibit. Inside USS Antiquities discover the diversity of life from its earliest beginnings. Learn how fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals have changed over time.

2 Diversity of Birds

The earth needs a variety of plants and animals to remain healthy. Explore biodiversity by discovering dozens of species of birds in our free-flight aviary.

3 Adaptation of Animals: Nocturnal Animals

Animals have developed many wonderful adaptations to survive. Discover bats, mole rats, sloths and more.

Visit the lions, meerkats, primates and fossa, and explore how living things relate to each other and to their environment.
